Facilities: Services are provided through the State Office in Fort Collins and 19 offices throughout Colorado.





Focus:

Forest health, sustainability and stewardship through programs and services, such as:

- Technical assistance for landowners
- Watershed protection
- Forestry and fire mitigation outreach and information
- Wildfire mitigation and fuels treatment planning and implementation
- Urban and community forestry
- Seedling trees and shrubs grown for reforestation and conservation
- Forest health assessment, inventory and analysis
- Other programs, such as:
 - Forest Agriculture Classification
 - Forest Legacy
 - Forest Stewardship
- Insect and disease surveying and monitoring
- Forest product marketing and utilization
- Forest management on state lands

Colorado is the third state to have 100+ communities receiving this designation.</p> <p>Community Wildfire Protection Plans: 220, to protect lives and property in Colorado</p>
<p>New or updated forest stewardship plans: 62, developed to assist landowners to meet specific landowner objectives including reviews of consultant-prepared forest agriculture plans. Acres covered: 3,852</p>	<p>Educational programs: 350+, reaching more than 12,000 Coloradans on insects and diseases, wildfire mitigation, forest marketing and utilization, community forestry and environmental education</p>
