1. Why not the Google Cloud?
 - Privacy/Security
 - Responsibility/loss of data control
 - Legal issues/data re-use
2. Working across boundaries/human dimensions: models for collaboration **AND** Human Dimensions of CI
 - Involvement of researchers
 - Support for C.I. use
 - End-User needs
3. What? There are still libraries buying print books, or why does anyone under the age of 30 still visit a library **AND** Will my great grand-daughter have access to my articles?
 - What's worth saving?
 - Migration of formats
 - Resource sharing & e-books
4. What's happening at your institution regarding Open Access **AND** Open Access or opening a can of worms?
 - All our institutions are interested and are all at different points

- OA needs to be faculty driven and allow for idea adjustment period
 - Requires extensive education & clarification. Survey/data gathering. Official stamp of approval
5. IT and Libraries: operational paradigms **AND** How do we respond/react to federally-mandated data management requirements?
- Demand is user-driven. Little unifying vision from the top. Does it matter?
 - Find ways for the groups to work together. Focus on solutions, not problems.
 - Co-created vision is best.
6. Copyright and Intellectual Property: The future of scholarly communications?
- Copyright is complex and confusing and most people just aren't aware of what its limits are and what right(s) they have.
 - There are a number of threats attached to the sharing of information and data: plagiarisem, stealing my idea, scooping
