## Three of YOUR possible Spring 2012 Break Locations

**Achiole, Panama** Participants will work with a local community center focusing on the environmental conservation and ecotourism. This group will experience the culture and customs will assisting with CEASPA with construction and environmental projects. This is a flying trip.

**Kanab, Utah** This trip features volunteer work at the Best Friends Animal Society, it is the nation's largest sanctuary for abused and abandoned animals. Pitch in by helping walk dogs, cuddle cats, assist with the agency mailings and much more. This is a driving trip.

**Washington, D.C.** Begin with the Student Homeless Challenge Project and redefine the meaning of the word "home." After the 48 hours of the challenge, participants will volunteer with the Community for Creative Non-Violence (CCNV), the nation's largest transitional homeless shelter. This is a flying trip.



**Alternative Break**  
 This program is an immersion experience into different cultural, environmental and socioeconomic communities across the nation. Students provide service in exchange for education about current social and cultural issues facing the host communities. Past trips have focused on social/cultural issues, such as hunger, AIDS/HIV, housing, homelessness, issues facing Native American living on reservations, environmental conservation, education, economic sustainability, and women's issues.




Figure 6: Monster Mail Out.
