


Figure 4: Losses




Figure 5: Losses [Detail 1]




Figure 7: Losses [Detail 3]




Figure 11: Losses [Detail 7]




Figure 13: Losses [Wax Paper Collage]




Figure 16: Losses [Video Screenshot 1]




Figure 19: Overwhelmed [Detail]
