

Rich Bircumshaw
1954-2009**



The 2009-10 Colorado State men's basketball media guide is dedicated to the memory of Rich Bircumshaw, who passed away in April.

Rich was a member of the Colorado State radio network since 1999, and had been the play-by-play voice of CSU basketball since 2002.

Willing to serve unselfishly as an ambassador for the ideals of the athletic department, he volunteered as an emcee for dozens of events each year. And when he wasn't speaking to large audiences, he was having quality one-on-one conversations with people.

In more than a decade with the Rams, countless players, coaches and staff came to know him as more than their broadcaster. They came to know him genuinely as a friend and supporter.

Rich, who said on several occasions that he had the quintessential face for radio, knew that friendship was more than skin deep. He counted among his friends several prominent figures in athletics and politics.

But throughout his three-plus decades in broadcasting, since his origins in Riverton, Wyo., he came in contact with junior high wrestlers, fourth-string offensive linemen, and walk-on forwards, and gave each one the same level of respect and authentic interest he would use to address any superstar. That did not go unnoticed, and will perhaps be his lasting legacy.





Colorado State University takes very seriously its role in educating student-athletes. Excellence is expected on the field and in the classroom.

The most recent NCAA academic statistics reveal that Colorado State leads the Mountain West Conference in graduation rate for student-athletes at 66 percent – well ahead of the conference’s overall student-athlete graduation rate of 57 percent. In football, Colorado State is second in the MWC, graduating 68 percent of its student-athletes – again, well ahead of the conference average of 49 percent.

Colorado State, however, is not resting on its reputation for graduating its student-athletes. The state-of-the-art Anderson Academic Center, which will greatly enhance the academic

facilities available for student-athletes, opens in August 2009.

While the athletic department takes its role in the educational process very seriously, Colorado State’s mission to provide a world-class education is at the core of academic success. U.S. News and World Report ranked Colorado State in its top tier in its annual “America’s Best Colleges” report. The university offers 79 majors and 27 minors, and many of its programs are ranked among the best in the country.

Colorado State continues to push forward in its mission to provide the best possible education. Construction recently was completed on the state-of-the-art University Center for the Arts and Computer Science buildings, and the Indoor Practice Facility, Academic and Training Center, and the College of Business’ Rockwell Hall expansion soon will be completed.



- CSU’s Veterinary Medicine program ranks second in the country and is the national leader in federal research dollars.
- *BusinessWeek* ranked CSU’s undergraduate College of Business program 67th (up from 73rd in 2008). The program ranks 30th among all public schools and 14th among all colleges and universities in the West and Southwest. The marketing and business law programs were ranked in the nation’s Top 10 by the magazine.
- In December 2008, CSU conferred its 150,000th bachelor’s degree and 200,000th overall degree.
- According to NCAA statistics, CSU’s graduation rate for student-athletes is higher than the graduation rate for the overall student body.





One of Colorado's most vibrant cities, Fort Collins is the best place in the country to live, work and play. Located on the northern Front Range of the majestic Rocky Mountains, the city is within an hour's drive of Denver, the nation's 25th-largest metro area.

This city of 137,200 residents basks in 300 days of sunshine per year — more than San Diego and Florida — and includes the historic Old Town district with its restaurants, shops, and entertainment, all within walking distance of Colorado State University's campus.

Since its founding as a military fort in 1864, Fort Collins has anchored northern Colorado's rich heritage of academic, business and recreational pursuits. Hiking, mountain biking, kayaking, river rafting and rock climbing are just a few popular outdoor pursuits for students and residents.

The city maintains more than 600 acres of parks, 5,000 acres of natural areas, 20 miles of off-street trails for hiking and biking, and three golf courses. The Lincoln Center and the University Center for the Arts, anchored in Fort Collins, are northern Colorado's cultural arts centers.








The Denver Metro Area, with a population of 2.4 million, is less than an hour's drive from Fort Collins. A major-league metropolis, twice named by the *Sporting News* at the best sports city in the United States, Denver is home to three teams that have competed for their respective world championships in the past 11 years — the Super Bowl XXXII and XXXIII champion Denver Broncos, the 1996 and 2001 Stanley Cup champion Colorado Avalanche, and the 2007 National League champion Colorado Rockies, who lost the World Series that season to the Boston Red Sox. The Denver Nuggets, meanwhile, just finished their most successful season in 24 years, going all the way to the NBA's Western Conference Finals before bowing out to the eventual world champion Lakers.

Sports fans in Colorado are among the most passionate in the nation, and for good reason — their teams are winners.

Denver has all the features of any big city, including great shopping and nightlife on the 16th Street Mall, a one-of-a-kind concert venue in Red Rocks Amphitheatre, an adrenaline-inducing amusement park in Elitch Gardens, and the world's 10th-busiest airport, Denver International.

Nicknamed the Mile High City because it is one mile above sea level, downtown Denver is home to the Colorado state capitol building, the 13th step of which is exactly one mile in elevation.



New Academic & Training Center



Cost: \$7 million
Size: 16,000 square feet,
Location: Southeast of the McGraw Athletic Center

Features:

- Training portion includes a state-of-the-art weight room, strength and conditioning offices, a nutrition center and restrooms.
- Academic center features five private tutorial rooms and large study areas
- Includes a computer lab with 30 workstations, more workspace and offices for CSU's academic staff.

In 1998, Colorado State enhanced its weight room and built an academic center as part of the McGraw Athletic Center project, but these facilities no longer meet the needs of its expanded student-athlete base, nor do they allow the Rams to compete for top-quality recruits.

Because of the heavy time constraints placed on CSU student-athletes through practice, travel, strength and conditioning, and community service, a quality learning environment is essential for the university's student-athletes to achieve the high standards of academic success expected of them.


The Academic and Training Center will be a centerpiece for CSU's athletic program and support its mission to recruit, educate, develop, and graduate Rams student-athletes within an environment that prusues excellence, values integrity and ethical conduct, promotes respect for all individuals, teaches sportsmanship, entertains our constituents and emphasizes championship performance.

New Indoor Practice Facility

Every CSU program will benefit from the Rams' new facilities. The Indoor Practice Facility will be used by all of the Rams' sports teams, whether they are in season or involved in offseason conditioning.



Cost: \$13 million

Size: 66,267 square feet, including 48,125 dedicated to the football portion and 8,827 to the basketball and volleyball areas

Height: 65 feet at its tallest point


Location: East of Moby Pool and north of the Student Recreation Center

Features:

- Gymnasium easily encloses a regulation basketball court and two half courts.
- Volleyball configuration can accommodate two full-length courts.
- Contains a 70-yard synthetic-turf football field (including one end zone).
- Features a four-lane, 70-meter track and a unique shoe-changing room adjacent to the football field.
- Has flexibility to allow the softball team to set up batting cages on the football field.
- Will provide shelter for any student-athlete in each of the Rams' 16 varsity sports.
- Includes training room, equipment storage, lobby and trophy display case, and restrooms.
- Uses an innovative air circulation system.



Moby Arena



Colorado State University boasts a rich and proud basketball tradition that dates back more than 100 years.

Part of that proud history includes one of the most distinctive and effective homecourt playing facilities in the nation. The team's home arena, Moby Arena, is a cozy and intimate playing facility nestled in the heart of the university's central campus area.

It's also an arena that through the years has spawned Moby Madness, the support of fans witnessing Rams basketball.

The arena features the pride and tradition of the Rams program that dates back a century and a newness associated with renovation projects completed in 1999, 2001 and 2009.

When the initial renovation was completed in 1999, the entire facility had undergone a major facelift, including all-new seating, meeting rooms, and a new locker room and player lounge area - which have again been updated for the 2009-10 season.

In 2001, another renovation took place in Moby Arena when an entirely new playing surface was installed. More than 23,000 square feet of hardwood was installed on the floor of the arena.

The combination of attractive playing facility, CSU's rich basketball history, and local university support combine to form Moby Madness.









Distinguished Alumni



Former All-American tight end Keli McGregor followed a record-setting collegiate career with the Rams by playing professional football. McGregor was selected by the Denver Broncos in the fourth round of the 1985 NFL Draft and played for the Broncos, Indianapolis Colts, and Seattle Seahawks before retiring. McGregor, a 1997 inductee into the CSU Athletic Hall of Fame, has become even more successful in business. He was named the President of Major League Baseball's Colorado Rockies on Oct. 18, 2001, and is responsible for the day-to-day operations of the club, which advanced to the World Series in 2007.

TIM MILES UNIVERSITY OF MARY (1989) THIRD SEASON AT CSU (16-47), 15TH SEASON OVERALL (228-179)

When Tim Miles came to Colorado State University to coach men's basketball he arrived on campus with a winning attitude and a smile. Both are essential to the program Miles is building with the Rams. His personality draws fans and student-athletes alike to him. His attitude is apparent in the feats that sprinkle through his resume.

Despite a pair of injury-plagued seasons to begin his tenure at Colorado State, Miles, his staff, and the team beat the odds time and time again, taking the first steps to re-establishing Colorado State men's basketball as a power in the Mountain West Conference, and on a national stage.

In 2007-08, Miles' first year with the program, he led a roster that featured just one returning starter to early season success, including a tournament championship at the BP Top of World Classic in Fairbanks, Alaska. And, after battling through a tough conference slate, the Rams ended the season on a high note with a victory over rival Wyoming in the opening round of the Mountain West Conference tournament.

His second season at Moby proved to be just as fruitful as the Rams continued to make strides. Miles led the Rams to early season victories over Montana and Northern Colorado, both of which had beaten the Rams the previous year, and CSU took national power Minnesota, led by Tubby Smith, to the brink of defeat before falling 72-71 at Moby Arena. In addition, the Rams boosted their win column with four conference wins against UNLV, Air Force (twice) and TCU.

Miles' persistence and hard work has not gone unnoticed by Colorado State and Athletic Director Paul Kowalczyk. In 2008, Miles was rewarded with a contract extension, and is now signed through the 2012-13 season.

"This university is committed to Tim and his staff," Kowalczyk said. "His leadership during tough times convinces us that we have the coach to lead our program to the upper echelon of the Mountain West."

Off the court, Miles believes strongly in academics, family and CSU.



"My job is to come in and establish a winning mentality in our basketball program," Miles said. "That means we're going to win outside hanging out with the students, we're going to win in the classroom when it comes to grades and we're going to win on the basketball floor."

While establishing a tradition of winning in college basketball, Miles' philosophy extends far beyond the basketball court. He and his staff are committed to academics and the success of their student-athletes in the classroom.

"It is essential that our players realize the value of their education at CSU," Miles said. "Academics are our top priority. We also want to represent this program, this university, and this community in a first-class manner at all times."



With 14 years of experience as a head coach at four institutions, he has compiled a career record of 228-179 that includes three conference championships and three national tournament appearances.

At North Dakota State, Miles earned 16 wins in each of his last five seasons, knocked off No. 8 Marquette and No. 15 Wisconsin, both on the road, and finished as one of only two independent programs with a winning record in 2006-07.

He also previously served as the head coach at Southwest Minnesota State University from 1997-2001 and Mayville State University from 1995-97. Miles began his coaching career in 1989 as an assistant at Northern State, where he served from 1989-95.

A native of Doland, S.D., Miles earned his bachelor's degree in elementary education and health/physical education from the University of Mary in 1989. He went on to earn his master's degree in health and physical science from Northern State in 1990.

Miles, and his wife, Kari, reside in Fort Collins with their daughter Ava, and son, Gabriel.

A knowledgeable bench coach with a lot of experience, Medved handles scouting responsibilities and works primarily with the guards throughout the season.





CRAIG SMITH NORTH DAKOTA (1996) THIRD SEASON AT CSU

Craig Smith returns to the Rams staff for his third season overall, and his second as an assistant coach, after making the transition from director of operations during the 2008-09 season.

Prior to Smith's arrival at Colorado State, he spent three seasons as head men's basketball coach at Mayville State University, where he compiled a record of 72-29 while advancing to three straight NAIA II national tournaments, including a trip to the NAIA II national championship game in 2007.

In his first season as a head coach in 2004-05, Smith resurrected a program that had only won a single game prior to his arrival and immediately earned a berth in the NAIA II national tournament. Smith followed that up in 2005-06 with a 28-6 mark, setting a record for most wins in school history while winning MSU's first ever Dakota Athletic Conference regular season and tournament championships. MSU advanced all the way to the national quarterfinals before losing to the eventual national champions. In 2006-07 MSU finished with a 27-9 record under Smith's leadership, winning MSU's second consecutive DAC regular season and tournament championships while advancing all the way to the NAIA II national championship game. Mayville's run to the national championship game marked the first time any men's basketball team from North Dakota had ever played for a national title.

Smith was named the NAIA II National Coach of the Year in 2007. He was also named Dakota Athletic Conference Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2007. Smith's MSU teams were characterized by their hard work and first-class attitude on and off the court. Mayville State's 2006-07 team was honored and recognized nationally with the Dr. James Naismith-Emil Liston Sportsmanship Award.

A native of Stephen, Minn., Smith began his collegiate coaching career at Mayville State University during the 1996-97 season. An assistant to then-Mayville State coach Tim Miles, MSU went 18-11, won the regular season NDCAC title and the conference postseason tournament before advancing to the NAIA II national tournament.

Prior to MSU, Smith worked as a graduate assistant at Northern State University during the 1997-98 season, followed by time at Minot State University as an assistant coach for three years, and then as an assistant coach under Miles at North Dakota State University.

Smith is a 1996 graduate of the University of North Dakota with a bachelor's degree in secondary education. He earned his master's degree from Northern State in teaching and learning. Smith and his wife, Darcy, have three boys—Landon (8), Brady (6) and Carson (4).

Prior to joining the Colorado State staff, Slocum served as an assistant coach at the University of Idaho.



Director of Athletics Paul Kowalczyk has placed Colorado State's program on an ambitious path toward national prominence with his insightful and visionary leadership.

Kowalczyk is in his fourth year leading CSU's program. From the moment he arrived on campus, he has shown a leadership style that is steady and consistent with ambitious goals clearly established.

Under his watchful eye, a founda-

tion has been built to cultivate long-term success throughout the program. With the foundation firmly in place, Colorado State's program stands on the threshold of taking a bold step forward nationally to reach "stretch goals" implemented by the Board of Governors when Kowalczyk arrived.

Perhaps nothing better illustrates the progress toward prominence that CSU's program has made during Kowalczyk's tenure than the changing skyline surrounding Moby Arena and the McGraw Athletic Center, both of which serve as centerpieces of the athletics department.

During the summer of 2009, CSU opened two state-of-the-art athletics facilities that are visually prominent to any avid Rams fan upon arriving on campus.

A training facility includes an indoor football practice field plus basketball and volleyball practice courts, adjacent to Moby Arena. Also, a new academic and strength and conditioning center is next to the McGraw Athletic Center.

The new facilities are among the finest in the nation, and will make CSU competitive nationally and enhance the institution's image across a broad spectrum.

The facilities represent one of Kowalczyk's primary goals when he was appointed to his position at CSU. Almost immediately upon his arrival, he worked closely with campus leaders to develop the facilities initiative.

"These buildings show that Colorado State is unmistakably serious about achieving its stretch goals," Kowalczyk said. "Combined with the recent renovations at our football stadium, this puts us where we need to be in terms of offering quality, state-of-the-art facilities for our coaches and student-athletes,

those who are here now and those who are thinking about coming here.”

The facilities also reflect Kowalczyk’s commitment to excellence throughout the program.

“Average is simply not good enough,” he said. “We must continually find ways to improve every aspect of our program while meeting the needs of our student-athletes and providing resources for our coaches -- not just to compete, but to win, and do it while serving the university, the community and the region.”

Soon after Kowalczyk’s arrival in Fort Collins, he worked closely with the Board of Governors of the Colorado State University System and the university leadership to set in place a set of “stretch goals.”

“The support of the board and campus administration, who were there every step of the way, was critical,” Kowalczyk said. “We have leadership on this campus that not only recognizes the importance of investing in athletics, but also what a successful athletics department can do for the university.”

Colorado State’s stretch goals include:

- Achieve a No. 1 ranking in the Director’s Cup, a ranking system that reflects overall program success;
- Annual Bowl Championship Series inclusion;
- NCAA men’s and women’s basketball tournament participation.

While the entire program under Kowalczyk’s guidance has moved forward with the completion of the facilities, he readily admits there are more challenges that lie ahead.

“We will never stand still. We will continue to move forward. As a program, we will strive for excellence in every area, just as we challenge our student-athletes in competition and in the classroom.

“Our efforts will always include continually and diligently working to expand our ticket and Ram Club donor base as a means to generate additional revenue and scholarship fund support.” Colorado State’s

expected emergence nationally has provided followers of the program optimism and excitement.

Kowalczyk brought a wealth of experience and knowledge to Fort Collins when he was named the school’s 16th Director of Athletics on April 11, 2006, after having served for six successful years in the same capacity at Southern Illinois University.

In the spring of 2008, he was named to the prestigious NCAA Division I Leadership Council, an advisory body to the Division I Board of Directors. The council identifies issues important to the future of Division I and offers its expertise in defining appropriate action items.

Kowalczyk also remains involved in NCAA, NACDA and MWC activities.


During his tenure at SIU, he led the Salukis’ emergence into a successful, nationally renowned athletics program, including 15 conference championships in seven sport programs.

Before his tenures at CSU and SIU, he was senior administrator at Northwestern University during a time in which the Wildcats program enjoyed national success. He also served as assistant athletics director for business operations at Kansas State, business manager for athletics at Portland State, and assistant to the associate athletics director at Kent State.

Kowalczyk holds a master’s degree in sports administration and a bachelor’s of business administration in accounting from Kent State University.

A native of Warren Ohio, Kowalczyk was inducted into the Warren High School Distinguished Hall of Fame. The award recognizes and honors individuals for their achievements and performance. In 2004, he received the National Football Foundation’s Gen. Robert R. Neyland Outstanding A.D. Award, and in 2006 was named the Athletic Director of the Year for the Division I-AA Central Division. Kowalczyk is also in the midst of serving a four-year term on the NACDA Executive Council, representing District 7.

He is married to Peg Lynch Kowalczyk.

Men's basketball Head Coach Tim Miles didn't need to create a theme for this year's team. He insists that his team creates its own message and identity.

Now two full seasons into his tenure at Colorado State, Miles has built a foundation on which he feels comfortable building.

"I think we finally have an idea of who we are," the third-year coach said. "Last year there was so much transition; our roster was so fluid that it was difficult to know what you were going to get night in and night out. I believe we now know who we are this year and I'm excited about that."

Despite the loss of two of last year's top scorers, Miles said the stability that this year's squad has could be even more beneficial.

"Having a star player can be good or bad for a team," Miles said. "If one guy takes over, the other team starts expecting it. I think our balance will be better and that'll be good for us."

The Rams will bring six seniors to the court in 2010, but the leader remains uncertain.

Of the seniors, Harvey Perry had the best season in 2009. In his debut year with the Rams, the 6-5 guard averaged 5.1 points a contest. It was in the second half of the season, however, when

Perry began to truly shine, scoring in 11 of his final 12 games. During that stretch, Perry scored in double figures five times, including a career-high 15 at Utah. While good with the ball, Perry was solid on both ends of the court, playing good defense and pulling down 4.3 rebounds a game.

"Last year, the games that Harvey played really well in, the team played really well," Miles said. "Essentially what I'm saying is the Rams go as Harvey Perry goes. I'm not trying to put a burden on Harvey, but Harvey needs to have a big year if we're going to have a big year."

Mame Bocar Ba, who, like Perry, joined the Rams from the College of Southern Idaho in 2008, will also be in his final year with the Rams.

In 2009, Ba scored in 16 of his 22 games played. The bigger factor for the 6-9 forward, however, was his ability to secure the basketball. Ba posted 2.5 rebounds a game, while recording 4.25 over the final four regular season games.

Rounding out the senior class are Arin Dunn and Michael Lebsack, who both received playing time in 2009 after beginning the year on the scout team, and Mike Annese, who saw limited action.

Dunn was the biggest surprise, catching Miles' attention in practice. By midseason, Miles was impressed enough to move him from a walk-on member of the practice team to a regular in the rotation. The junior-college transfer from Lamar Community

College averaged nearly 15 minutes in 14 appearances. Dunn shot .423 from the floor and led all Rams players hitting 60 percent (9-of-15) from beyond the arc.

But the senior class might not be the primary source of production for Miles.

Led by Andy Ogide and Andre McFarland, five players make up the strong junior class. Also featured is Adam Nigon (27 steals), Travis Franklin (6.5 points per game) and newcomer Johnny Del Bene.

"That sophomore class was our strongest element, last year," Miles said. "Now they're juniors and we expect more out of them. That may be where we get the most leadership from."

McFarland started and scored in all 31 games for the Rams in 2009, including scoring double figures 11 times. He averaged 8.4 points a contest, good for fifth in the MWC among sophomores, while shooting .423 from beyond the arc, leading the team with an .809 free-throw percentage and ranking second with 126 rebounds.

While McFarland has the experience, it's Ogide who Miles believes may be the biggest asset to the Colorado State program.

"Andy Ogide has a chance to be a first-team all-league player in the Mountain West," said Miles. "If he shows the consistency and the tenacity, he could be very good for us."

In his sophomore season, Ogide averaged 10.2 points a game while converting 50 percent of his shot attempts. He led the team in rebounds (5.8 per game), blocked shots (19 total) and double-doubles (4).

Jesse Carr is the lone eligible sophomore on the Colorado State roster, but his stats from his rookie season were good enough for more than one player.

The Nebraska native etched himself into the Rams record books for fourth place all-time among freshmen with 8.8 points per game. His team-leading 63 assists also ranks fourth for freshmen. Carr shot .443 from the field and .344 from beyond the arc and averaged 26.6 minutes a contest before missing the final six games of the season due to a strained groin. That, in addition to a hip injury, has kept Carr off the court during the entire offseason. His status for 2010 is uncertain, but Miles remains optimistic.

Miles' vision is set on now, but he also is planning for the future. In what he calls his first true test in terms of recruiting, he brought in several players that could build the future of the program.

"I'm excited to get to know these guys and invest time in them," Miles said. "I'm excited about that incoming class and their future development."

From out of state, the Rams picked up Kansas' Dorian Green (22.6 points per game, scored in double figures in all regular-season games, 3-to-1 assist-to-turnover ratio) and Mr. Nebraska, Greg Smith (18.7 points and nine rebounds per game, All-Nebraska first-team captain).

Inside Colorado borders, Ralston Valley's Pierce Hornung (forward) and Lutheran's Trevor Williams (7-foot center) will appear in green and gold.

Said Miles, "every good team has a Pierce."

Also signed was Travis Busch, a transfer from the University of Minnesota who has one year of eligibility remaining, and Iowa State transfer Wes Eikmeier, who will sit out this season due to NCAA regulations, but has three years of eligibility remaining.

Last season saw signs of improvement from Miles' first season, including the program's first road win in nearly two years, a regular season-sweep over Air Force and Miles' first regular-season conference win, a 71-69 triumph over UNLV, snapping an 11-game losing streak against the Rebels dating back to 2004.

"I thought we showed a little progress last year," Miles said. "We won four league games and essentially gave away three others. It's frustrating, but I think sometimes you have to go through those difficult moments in order to move forward. I would expect another jump forward this year. Ultimately, our goal is to raise the bar."

The four-win improvement was the biggest jump since the 1994-95 to 1995-96 seasons.

As Miles stated, the MWC is a tough conference, which saw six of the Rams' eight conference opponents play in the postseason last year.


During the 2009-10 season, the Rams will host Montana, San Francisco, Yale and Mayville State, where Miles and assistant coach Craig Smith began their coaching careers, in addition to intrastate rivals Colorado and Denver.

Also on the slate is a November trip to Terre Haute, Ind., to take on the Indiana State Sycamores, a home matchup against Northern Arizona and a road trip out west to face the UCLA Bruins and former WAC rival Fresno State.

The Basketball Travelers Tip-off Tournament in Eugene, Ore., will give the Rams a chance to go head-to-head with UC Davis, Winston-Salem State and Pac-10 powerhouse Oregon. After playing in the championship game of the Rainbow Classic last season, the Rams are 7-1 in midseason tournaments since the 2006-07 season.

"I think fans have a lot to look forward to," Miles said. "I believe they will be able to see an improved product on the floor and that should get them excited about Colorado State basketball."



2007-08 Season Review

Two years into the Tim Miles era in Fort Collins, the Colorado State men's basketball program appears headed down the right path.

And following the 2008-09 season, which saw the Rams post a record of 9-22 against a stacked Mountain West Conference, which saw six of its nine teams playing in postseason action last March, the Rams have a solid group of core players returning for this season, as well as an excellent recruiting class headed for Moby Arena.

"Turning this program around is what I was hired to do and it's something I believe we can do," said Miles. "There have been more obstacles than I originally thought, but the support of our athletic department, along with the dedication of our coaching staff and student-athletes, will lead us where we want to go. I feel very positive about the direction of this program."

In addition to the return of several key players from 2008-09, the Rams will add an influx of talent this fall when practice begins. Forward Greg Smith from Ralston, Neb., will join CSU as a freshman, after leading his team to a Nebraska state title last March. In the title game, Smith posted 23 points and 10 rebounds. Also signing National Letters of Intent to join CSU are Pierce Hornung, a 6-5 forward from Ralston Valley High School and Trevor Williams, a 7-0 center from Denver Lutheran High School.

"We are extremely excited about our class for this year," said Miles. "We are thrilled to add these young guys to our program. They all bring the energy, passion and ability to help CSU basketball reach its goals. We are not only excited about their talents, but also the fact they are invested in CSU and our mission to bring this program to the top of the MWC."

Those young, talented newcomers expect to fit in alongside the returning core, led by a strong rising junior class and sophomore-to-be Jesse Carr. The Rams will return starters

Andy Ogide (10.2 points and team-high 5.8 rebounds) and Andre McFarland (team-high 55 three-pointers), along with key reserves Travis Franklin (6.5 points and 3.6 rebounds) and Adam Nigon (2.6 points, 27 steals in 28 games played). Carr, who ranked third in the conference in scoring among freshmen in 2008-09 (8.8 points, team-high 63 assists in 25 games played), will return to the Rams at a guard position after an outstanding freshman campaign. Three seniors should highlight the Rams' roster with the return of Harvey Perry (11 starts), Mame Bocar Ba (2.5 rebounds in 11.6 minutes per game), and walk-on Arin Dunn (2.9 points in 14 games), who played major minutes for the Rams in the latter part of the season.

This offseason was a busy one for Miles, who traveled across the country on recruiting trips, something he did for a large portion of the season.

"Going out and seeing kids playing in their hometowns and against good competition is a very important part of the recruiting process," said Miles. "It's what is necessary right now for us to find out what we need to about the kids we want to bring into this program."

After watching his former team, the North Dakota State Bison, capture the Summit League title in dramatic fashion and earn the conference's automatic bid to the 2009 NCAA tournament in its first season as a Division I eligible team, Miles remains confident that the same is possible at Colorado State. During his time at NDSU, Miles turned around a program that went 11-15 in his first season, to 20-8 in his last, 2006-07.

Colorado State Rich In Tradition

Rams basketball history can be traced from A to Z: Donald Abbot to Robert Zimdahl. From Boyd Grant, the only player in school history to later serve as the Rams' head coach, to Lonnie Wright, an all-star guard for the Rams in the 1960s who competed for a spot on the Olympic Team.

Wright was the first athlete in history to compete in professional football (Denver Broncos, AFL) and professional basketball (Denver Rockets, ABA) simultaneously.

Then there is the legend of Bill Green, the school's first basketball All-American, who concluded his playing career in 1963 and was a first-round draft choice by the Boston Celtics. Green, who despised air travel, passed on a pro career to instead chase his educational dreams. He earned a master's degree, then a doctorate and was a decorated teacher and administrator.

Until his death in 1994, Green was regarded as one of the nation's foremost educators in his position at a middle school in The Bronx, N.Y.

In The Beginning...

Any and all discussions involving Rams basketball history begin with legendary coach Jim Williams.

For 26 seasons, Williams roamed the sidelines at Colorado State. Depending on the need and the case, Williams coddled, coerced, shoved, pushed, forced and massaged the school's basketball program into one of the finest in the nation.

Williams was an innovator, a basketball devotee, when he arrived in Fort Collins in time for the 1954-55 season. Williams followed Bill Strannigan, who left for Iowa State after having guided Colorado State to its first-ever NCAA berth in 1954.

Williams had finished a hitch in the military when he moved to Ephraim, Utah, as a football and basketball coach. He stayed there until coming over the Rockies to take control of Colorado State's program.

One of the players who joined him in Fort Collins was a slender, talented scoring guard named Boyd Grant. After helping the Rams succeed as a player, Grant stayed on as an assistant to Williams for several years.

Grant returned as head coach in 1988 to lead the Rams to a third-place NIT finish and back-to-back conference championships and NCAA appearances.

In 26 seasons, Williams put the program on college basketball's map. The Rams won 352 games and played in the NCAA tournament four times and the NIT twice. Williams' teams played 635 games under his watch - almost 30 percent of the school's total entering the 2009-10 season.

Grant Makes A Return...

For 35 years, Boyd Grant's heart had been in Fort Collins.

Grant followed his heart back to Fort Collins in 1988 to rejuvenate the Rams' basketball fortunes.

He wasted little time in restoring the pride, tradition, and excellence that had existed during his previous time with the program.

Grant in 1988 guided the Rams to 23 wins and a third-place finish in the NIT. It was the first time in two decades that Colorado State had been involved in postseason competition.

The Rams simply didn't finish the season with 23 victories. Grant and the Rams brought the madness back to Moby.

Once invited to the NIT, the Rams played three home games before overflow crowds in Moby Arena and then traveled to New York City and Madison Square Garden for the semifinals. Following a last-second loss to Ohio State in the semifinals, the Rams defeated Boston College, finishing with a 22-13 record.

In 1989, Grant and the Rams, behind the play of all-star forward Pat Durham and shooting ace Joel Tribelhorn, won a school-record 11 consecutive games and, in the process, Colorado State's first-ever WAC title.

In 1969, he guided Colorado State to the final eight of the NCAA tournament. Following a first-round victory over Dayton, the Rams defeated in-state rival Colorado, 64-56, in the regional semifinals in Manhattan, Kan. Two days later, the team narrowly missed a chance to make the school's first-ever Final Four trip, losing to Drake, 84-77.

During his career, Williams guided Colorado State to four NCAA and two NIT appearances, including the glorious '69 season. He won more games, 352, than any college basketball coach at any level in state history.

Williams' career at Colorado State wasn't simply about wins and losses. It was about building a program, as he served as athletic director when the school began construction of Hughes Stadium and Moby Arena.

Names like Chuck Newcomb, Stan Albert, Mike Childress, Gary Rhoades, Rudy Carey, Eddie Hughes, Tim Hall, Rick Fisher, Cliff Shegogg, and the Kerr twins, Lloyd and Floyd, all bring to mind the many who etched their names among the prominent figures in Rams history.

Let it be noted that Williams stood toe-to-toe with UCLA's blossoming basketball program and its coach, John Wooden. Colorado State attracted national attention with the challenging schedules Williams put before his team, including annual dates with UCLA.

Back to the Future...

Dale Layer took over the Colorado State program in 2001, intent on nurturing growth and respecting the history that has embodied the program for a century.

Layer was no stranger to Colorado State's program, having spent two seasons as an assistant during a time the Rams won 37 games - 24 in Moby Arena - and achieved an NIT final eight berth.

In 1999, Colorado State shocked the basketball world by winning 19 games with a team returning only two seniors and one starter. The Rams advanced to the final eight of the NIT behind the play of senior leaders Milt Palacio and Andre McKanstry. Palacio turned in his Colorado State jersey for a career in the NBA.

The Rams, in the postseason for the second year in a row and fourth time in a decade, dispatched Mississippi State, 69-56, to advance to the second round.

Colorado State faced in-state rival Colorado before a capacity crowd in Moby Arena. Shaking off a double-digit first-half deficit, the Rams moved to the final eight of the tournament with a convincing 86-76 victory in one of the most emotional games in school history. The rivals, separated by only 50 miles, met in the postseason for the first time since the 1969 classic in the NCAA tournament.

A year later, the Rams won 18 games led by the stalwart play of Ceedric Goodwyn. He was the only player in the Mountain West Conference to score in double figures every game, and like Palacio, was destined for a professional career. Twice during the season the Rams defeated nationally ranked teams, including UCLA and Utah, and at one point had a streak of 11 consecutive victories over Front Range rivals.

In 2003 the Rams claimed their first conference title in 13 years. Brian Greene hit a running jumper against UNLV with only seconds remaining to take a one-point lead over the Rebels and earn a trip to the NCAA tournament.

In 2006 Jason Smith was named as Colorado State's first ever all-Mountain West Conference first-team selection.

The Rams won 17 games and Smith earned all-Mountain West first-team honors for the second consecutive season in 2006-07. Smith was chosen by the Miami Heat with the 20th overall pick in the 2007 NBA Draft.

A week later, the journey continued when the Rams routed Florida of the SEC, 68-48, in the first round of the NCAA tournament before losing to Syracuse, a squad featuring five future NBA players in the starting lineup. The Rams finished with a 23-10 record, setting a record for most wins in a season in school history.

Grant and the Rams weren't finished. Their encore included another WAC title in 1990 and a trip to the NCAA tournament. Alabama defeated the Rams in the first round, but not before Colorado State had enjoyed a third consecutive 20-win season with a 21-9 final record. Grant won 81 games in four seasons, averaging more than 20 victories per season in returning Colorado State's program to elite status.

Grant was followed along the sidelines by Stew Morrill, who in seven seasons won 20 games twice and guided Colorado State to a pair of NIT appearances. Morrill and his staff helped continue the resurgence of Colorado State's program that began with Grant's return to Moby Arena.

SANTA CLARA 73, COLORADO STATE 50

Corvallis, Ore. - In the first round of the NCAA tournament, on March 12, 1954, Colorado State lost to Santa Clara 73-50. At halftime, Santa Clara led Colorado State 44-27 and, although scoring was close in the second half, Santa Clara's first half lead proved to be insurmountable. Two of Colorado State's players scored in double figures with Dennis Stuehling leading Colorado State with 18 points and Ronald Caylor adding 11.

IDAHO STATE 62, COLORADO STATE 57

OKLAHOMA CITY 70, COLORADO STATE 67

Lubbock, Texas - On March 9, 1963, in the first round of the NCAA tournament, Colorado State dropped a first round game to Oklahoma City University by a score of 70-67. During the first half of the game, Colorado State went on a 19-5 run to lead 42-31 at halftime and kept the lead through most of the second half, but lost the lead with 42 seconds left in the game. CSU could not regain the lead and lost 70-67. Four of Colorado State's players scored in double figures, led by Bill Green who had a double-double with 19 points, 12 rebounds. CSU's other top scorers included Terry Matthews with 17 points, Dave Sigafoos with 12 points, and Gary Anderson with 10 points. Brian Etheridge led Colorado State with 15 rebounds.

OKLAHOMA CITY 78, COLORADO STATE 70

Lubbock, Texas - In the first round of the NCAA tournament, on March 8, 1965, Colorado State was defeated by Oklahoma City University by a score of 78-70. Colorado State kept it close throughout the first half, but trailed 36-32 at halftime. Colorado State was down the entire second half of the game. With 51 seconds left in the game CSU tied the game up 68-68, but couldn't make a shot before Oklahoma City scored the winning basket with one second left in the game. Colorado State's Sonny Bustion had a double-double with 30 points, 20 rebounds. Two other CSU players scored in double figures: Dick Vidakovich scored 13 points, and William Westoby scored 12.

HOUSTON 82, COLORADO STATE 76

Wichita, Kan. - On March 7, 1966, Colorado State was defeated 82-76 by Houston University in the first round of the NCAA tournament. Colorado State trailed the entire first half, and headed to the locker room down 44-35 at halftime. In the second half, CSU went on a few short runs to keep the game close but with one minute left in regulation, CSU tried to go on a quick run to continue on in the playoffs but fell short and lost by a score of 82-76. Five of CSU's players scored in the double digits. Bobby Rule led the team with 18 points while Lonnie Wright was the second leading scorer with 17 points. Other top scorers were: Dick Vidakovich with 14 points, Richard Fines with 11 points, and Dale Schlueter who had a double-double with 11 points and 19 rebounds.

COLORADO STATE 52, DAYTON 50

Fort Worth, Texas - On March 8, 1969, in the first round of the NCAA tournament, Colorado State beat the University of Dayton 52-50 earning its first-ever NCAA Tournament victory. Colorado State used a 17-9 first half run to lead by a score of 27-23 at halftime. In the second half of the game, the lead switched back and forth between the two teams seven times and with three minutes left in the game, the score was tied 49-49. Colorado State made two free throws and that was all CSU needed to clinch a spot in the second round. Colorado State went on to win the game 52-50. Colorado State's leading scorers were: Lloyd Kerr with 17 points, Clifford Shegogg with 12 points, and Floyd Kerr with 11 points.

COLORADO STATE 64, COLORADO 56

Manhattan, Kan. - In the second round of the NCAA tournament, on March 13, 1969, Colorado State defeated the University of Colorado, by a score of 64-56. The first half of the game was a close one, but Colorado State scored four points in the last 42 seconds of the half to lead 28-27 at halftime. Colorado State allowed Colorado to score the first three points in the second half but tied the game up in the next few seconds and never looked back. Colorado State outscored CU 14 to 10 in the last four minutes of the game and went on to win the game 64-56, landing them a spot in the NCAA Midwest Regional Finals. Colorado State had four major contributors to the win. Clifford Shegogg led the team with 20 points, Floyd Kerr scored 14, Lloyd Kerr scored 12 points, and Michael Davis had a double-double with 10 points and 13 rebounds.

DRAKE 84, COLORADO STATE 77

Manhattan, Kan. - On March 15, 1969, Colorado State competed against Drake in the NCAA Midwest Regional Finals, but lost by a score of 84-77. The first half of this regional finals game was neck and neck. The teams went into their locker rooms at halftime, with Drake holding a narrow 38-37 lead. The second half was much like the first. The teams were neck and neck but once Drake pulled out to a 72-69 lead, with four and a half minutes left, they never looked back. Drake went on to win the game 84-77. Four of Colorado State's players scored in double figures led by Floyd Kerr, who scored 21 points. William Peden was the second leading scorer with 19 points. The other leading scorers were Lloyd Kerr with 12 points, and Michael Davis had a double-double with 13 points and 16 rebounds.

COLORADO STATE 68, FLORIDA 46

Dallas, Texas - In the first round of the NCAA tournament, on March 17, 1989, Colorado State defeated the Florida Gators 68-46. Once Colorado State scored the first basket in the game, they kept the game under control. At halftime, Colorado State was ahead 31-22. CSU kept building its lead throughout the second half of the game, and with two and a half minutes remaining in the game, CSU was ahead by 18 points. Colorado State went on to win the game by a score of 68-46. Colorado State's leading scorers were Joel Tribelhorn with 20 and Pat Durham with 16. With a win in the first round, CSU continued on to the second round of the NCAA Playoffs.

SYRACUSE 65, COLORADO STATE 50

Dallas, Texas - On March 19, 1989, in the second round of the NCAA tournament, Colorado State fell to Syracuse 65-50. In the first half of the game, Colorado State tried to keep the game close as they went into the locker room, but trailed by a score of 38-28 at halftime. In the second half of the game, the closest CSU could get to Syracuse was 10 points. The Orangemen continued to increase the gap and won by a final score of 65-50. Andy Anderson scored 15 points, and was the only Colorado State player to score in double figures.

ALABAMA 71, COLORADO STATE 54

Long Beach, Calif. - On March 16, 1990, Colorado State was defeated by Alabama, by a score of 71-54 in the first round of the NCAA tournament. In the first half of the game, the lead changed three times. At one point, CSU led by seven points. But Alabama surged back, outscoring CSU 18-3 in the last 10 minutes of the half. Alabama led Colorado State 33-22 at halftime. and in the second half, Alabama took off and never looked back. At one point Alabama led CSU by 20 points and won the game by a score of 71-54. In the loss, two Rams scored in double figures. Mike Mitchell led the team with 24 points and Mark Meredith contributed 15 points.

DUKE 67, COLORADO STATE 57

Salt Lake City, Utah - On March 20, 2003, Colorado State earned the right to play Duke in the first round of the NCAA tournament but fell by a score of 67-57. The Blue Devils jumped out to an early lead but CSU came back to tie the score 20-20 before an 11-2 Duke run put them up by nine. The Rams trailed by just two with 3:01 to play but the postseason experience of the Blue Devils showed through as they answered CSU's six-point run with an eight-point run of their own to close the game on top by ten. Brian Greene led CSU with a 14-point, 10-rebound night while coming up with three steals in the game.





Media Credentials

- Media credentials are distributed on a season or single-game basis. Requests should be made at least one week prior to an event.

- Credentials will be left prior to the match at media will call, located at the lower (ground level) southwest entrance of Moby Arena, adjacent to the Academic & Training Center and north of the Ram Field softball complex.

Parking

- Access to the parking lot immediately west of the McGraw Center will require an "A" permit from 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. weekdays
- Annual permits can be purchased through the Office of Parking Management Web site: www.colostate.edu/depts/parking.
- Event parking permits will be made available to credentialed media for home games at Moby Arena. To acquire an event parking pass contact a member of the CSU media relations staff.

Photographer Guidelines

- Photo credentials are issued only to accredited photographers. Passes must be displayed at all times.
- Photographer's boxes are located at both ends of the playing court, on the south side of each basket standard, opposite the team benches. Still and video photographers are allowed to be positioned in either of these boxes only.
- Photography is not allowed from any of the courtside media or donor seating along either baseline or the south side of the playing court, the team bench area, or official scorer's table.
- No photography equipment (i.e., cameras, strobes) shall be attached to the backboard, goal standards or tables located courtside without specific, prior written permission.
- Still photographers may not utilize flash attachments at any courtside location.
- Tripods may not be placed on or beside the playing floor, or on any table.
- Upper-level still and video photographer positions are located above the south side seating areas and in the press box overhead on the north side. Photographers are unable to use the south side location for any game that is being televised. Individuals seeking to use the north side location must be granted permission by a member of the athletic media relations staff.

Interview Guidelines

- Interviews, either in person or via telephone, with members of Colorado State's men's basketball coaching staff and student-athletes must be coordinated through assistant media relations director Danny Mattie.
- Home and/or cell phone numbers will not be provided to the media, by the coaches, student-athletes, or the athletic department. Media are asked not to request an individual's personal contact information, including e-mail and cell number, but rather to contact Danny Mattie.
- Student-athletes and coaches are available for interviews at the conclusion of selected practice sessions. Student-athlete interviews will not conflict with classes, meetings, medical treatment or practice times.
- Interviews are not permitted in the locker room or training room.
- No pregame interviews will be granted on game days.
- Telephone interviews should be requested at least 24 hours in advance and coordinated through Danny Mattie. All interviews will be processed on an availability basis involving the requested interviewee.

Postgame Guidelines

- At the conclusion of every game, Colorado State coach Tim Miles will use the NCAA-suggested 10-minute cooling period to address members of the team.
- At the conclusion of the NCAA-suggested cooling period, Miles will address the media in the Adolf Coors Family Foundation Auditorium, Room 100, in the McGraw Athletic Center.
- Colorado State's locker room is closed to the media at all times. Specific players will be brought to the press conference upon request.
- The media relations office will do its best to accommodate all properly made requests.
- Other than network contractual obligations, no student-athlete or coach can appear on a live postgame television or radio interview without permission obtained prior to the game from Danny Mattie.

MWC Teleconference

- The Mountain West Conference men's basketball coaches will participate in a weekly media teleconference Jan.4-March 8, 2010
- The calls are scheduled every Monday and can be heard live via the MWC Web site or by contacting the MWC communications office for the call-in number.
- This teleconference is for accredited media only.
- A replay of each teleconference will be made available on the MWC Web site.
- Colorado State Head Coach Tim Miles is scheduled to be available to media on the conference call between 11:12-11:22 a.m. each week.

Broadcast Rights and Restrictions

Colorado State, its opponent and the respective conference designate the broadcast rights for all games. CSU follows the guidelines established by the NCAA Championship Events Committee. Radio and television stations and Internet sites that have not purchased rights shall not carry any broadcast report from the arena on a live basis or any live description, footage of any game action while it is still in progress. No pregame and, or postgame live coverage shall be permitted for two hours before and one-half hour after the sporting event without the express permission of the university. Per NCAA guidelines, stations are limited to three minutes of highlights per news show. Television stations also are prohibited from selling, loaning or giving away footage to any individual or agency for use on any non-sports-news program produced or aired by the station. Matches that are broadcast by television networks may have additional restrictions. Also, per NCAA regulations, footage and photos of athletes with eligibility remaining may NOT be used to commercially promote any product, service or media outlet and may not be sold, loaned to other individuals, agencies for this purpose. Disrespect of credential privileges will result in withdrawal of all future credentials

The Mountain West Conference

This is the Mountain West

From its inception in 1999, the Mountain West Conference has been committed to excellence in intercollegiate athletics, while promoting the academic missions of its member institutions. Fresh off the celebration of its 10th anniversary in 2008-09, the MWC continues to cultivate opportunities for student-athletes to compete at the highest level, while fostering academic achievement and sportsmanship. Over its 10-year history, the MWC has been assertive in its involvement with the NCAA governance structure and has taken a leadership role in the overall administration of intercollegiate athletics.

Progressive in its approach, the MWC has marked several achievements over its first decade of existence, most notably becoming the first to establish a sports television network dedicated solely to an intercollegiate athletic conference (The Mtn.). The Mountain West also was the first to experiment with the coaches challenge in the college football instant replay system, and was the first non-automatic-qualifying BCS conference to participate in and win two BCS bowl games. Additionally, the Mountain West was the first conference to have a member institution with No. 1 overall picks in both the NFL and NBA drafts in the same year (Utah's Alex Smith and Andrew Bogut, respectively in 2005). With San Diego State's Stephen Strasburg claiming the No. 1 pick in the 2009 MLB Draft, the Mountain West is the only conference to have the No. 1 selection in each of the NFL, NBA and MLB drafts since the conference was founded in 1999. The MWC also ranks second in No. 1 draft picks in the NFL, NBA and MLB over the last five years with three overall, one behind the SEC which currently has four.

The Mountain West Conference is noted for its geographic diversity. Some of the most beautiful terrain and landscapes in the nation can be found within Mountain West Conference boundaries, including the majestic Rocky Mountain range, which borders four MWC schools (Air Force, BYU, Colorado State and Utah). The high plains of Wyoming (elevation 7,220 feet – the highest Division I campus in the nation) contrast with the desert city of Las Vegas (the fastest growing metropolitan area in the West) and the Pacific Ocean locale of San Diego State. The southwestern flavor of New Mexico complements the western heritage and culture of Fort Worth, Texas, home of the MWC's most recent member, TCU.

History

The Mountain West Conference was conceived on May 26, 1998, when the presidents of eight institutions — Air Force, BYU, Colorado State, New Mexico, San Diego State, UNLV, Utah and Wyoming — decided to form a new NCAA Division I-A intercollegiate athletic conference. The split from the former 16-team conference re-established continuity and stability among the membership within the new league and signaled the continuation of its tradition-rich, long-standing athletic rivalries. Five of the MWC's eight original members have been conference rivals since the 1960s (BYU, Utah, New Mexico, Wyoming, Colorado State), while San Diego State (1978) and Air Force (1980) were longtime members as well. UNLV and TCU entered the fold in 1996 and the Reb-

els continued as one of the original eight institutions that formed the MWC in 1999. TCU rejoined the group with its first year of competition in the Mountain West in 2005-06, completing the Conference membership as it stands today.

When the MWC officially began operations on July 1, 1999, the new league had in place a seven-year contract with ESPN, giving the broadcaster exclusive national television rights to MWC football and men's basketball, and three-year agreements to send the league's football champion to the Liberty Bowl and a second team to the Las Vegas Bowl. Commissioner Craig Thompson also arranged a third bowl tie-in each of the first three years (1999 Motor City, 2000 Silicon Valley, 2001 New Orleans) before securing a four-year deal with the Emerald Bowl in San Francisco in 2002. An innovator in the postseason bowl structure, the MWC engineered many "firsts," as league teams have participated in five inaugural bowl games (2000 Silicon Valley, 2001 New Orleans, 2002 San Francisco (Emerald), 2005 Poinsettia, 2006 New Mexico), as well as placing the first non-automatic-qualifying BCS team into a BCS bowl game with Utah's appearance in the 2005 Tostitos Fiesta Bowl.

Exposure

With the addition of The Mtn. - The MountainWest Sports Network to DIRECTV on August 27, 2008, the Mountain West Conference enjoyed unprecedented national television exposure in 2008-09 with 48 football, 103 men's basketball and 32 women's basketball contests airing across the country through a combination of telecasts on The Mtn., CBS College Sports Network (formerly CSTV) and VERSUS. In addition to the new satellite carriage agreement, The Mtn. has been available to cable subscribers in the MWC footprint since it first aired in 2006-07.

On Aug. 26, 2004, College Sports Television (CSTV) and the Mountain West Conference announced a visionary partnership that revolutionized the college sports landscape. The landmark agreement was the first NCAA Division I football and men's basketball conference-wide deal for CSTV and provided the network exclusive rights to all Conference events, including cable and satellite television coverage, national over-the-air and satellite radio, video-on-demand and online broadcast rights.

A succession of events since the fall of 2004 has improved the television model, including CSTV's joint venture with Comcast SportsNet to create The Mtn., and CBS Corporation's purchase of CSTV. CBS acquired CSTV in January 2006, and on Feb. 12, 2008, incorporated CSTV's cable, broadcast and online activities into its world-famous brand as the CBS College Sports Network (CBS C). The Mtn. is co-owned by CBS College Sports Network and Comcast SportNet.

The relationship with Comcast SportNet also delivered a new national broadcast partner in VERSUS. The MWC was the first exclusive college programming provider for the Comcast-owned entity, with football and both men's and women's basketball games. The CBS C/MWC partnership has guaranteed greater levels of television exposure for all league sports and has resoundingly met the fundamental goals of more exposure and preferred start times and dates.

In the summer of 2006, the centerpiece of this historic relationship was realized with the launch of The Mtn. – the first sports network dedicated to serving a single collegiate athletic conference. The Mtn. provides sports fans blanket coverage of MWC athletics across

multiple sports, including football, men's and women's basketball, and men's and women's Olympic sports. The Mtn. features more than just live games and has added its own original programming. Fans get a comprehensive array of news, features and analysis about their favorite MWC teams and players. More than 17,000 hours of MWC programming have aired on The Mtn. since the network's launch on Sept. 1, 2006, and over 250 MWC events are shown live on annually through a combination of telecasts on The Mtn., CBS College Sports Network and VERSUS. CBS College Sports Network is currently in 30 million homes, and available in over 84 million nationwide. VERSUS is in more than 74 million households across the U.S.

The MWC has remained steadfast in its mission to promote the league's athletic events to national and regional television audiences and will continue to grow its new TV model. Previously, ESPN served as the league's inaugural official television partner, while in-house productions guaranteed coverage for several MWC Olympic sports. Through the league's first 10 years, excluding institutional local packages, more than 1,350 football, volleyball, men's basketball and women's basketball events have aired on television, with 225 football games and over 260 men's basketball contests broadcast nationally.


