
As Colorado's land-grant university, Colorado State was founded in 1870 to fulfill the vision of President Abraham Lincoln and others—to create access and opportunity for people in Colorado and around the world who can benefit from hands-on, engaged learning.

With more than 150 programs of study and 78 undergraduate degree programs in eight colleges—and a faculty-to-student ratio of 16.5:1—students have access to a wealth of educational possibilities. Colorado State leads the world in disciplines such as human and animal health, clean energy and the environment, global and sustainable business, engineering, and climate research. Along with outstanding programs in the liberal and performing arts, humanities and social sciences, Colorado State offers some of the top professional programs in the country in construction management, occupational therapy, psychology, communications and agriculture—and is home to the top-ranked public business school in the state.

Challenging academic programs and world-changing research are hallmarks of Colorado State, and it is our special commitment to service, outreach, and transforming our world through innovation that sets this university apart. Even more important, CSU's character is reflected in the quality of our students and graduates, who embody the university's mission of service and go on to make a significant impact on our world when they graduate.

- CSU's Veterinary Medicine program ranks third in the country, also ranking third in national federal research dollars.
- BusinessWeek ranked CSU's undergraduate College of Business program 67th. The marketing and business law programs were ranked in the nation's Top 10 by the magazine.
- In 2008, CSU conferred its 150,000th bachelor's degree and 200,000th overall degree.
- According to NCAA statistics, CSU's graduation rate for student-athletes is higher than the graduation rate for the overall student body.

**C**olorado State University takes very seriously its role in educating student-athletes. Excellence is expected on the field and in the classroom.

The most recent NCAA academic statistics reveal that Colorado State leads the Mountain West Conference in graduation rate for student-athletes at 66 percent – well ahead of the conference's overall student-athlete graduation rate of 57 percent. In football, Colorado State is second in the MW, graduating 68 percent of its student-athletes – again, well ahead of the conference average of 49 percent. Additionally, CSU student-athletes graduate at a higher percentage than the general student body.



Colorado State, however, is not resting on its reputation for graduating its student-athletes. The state-of-the-art Anderson Academic Center, which has greatly enhanced the academic facilities available for student-athletes, opened in August 2009.



While the athletic department takes its role in the educational process very seriously, Colorado State's mission to provide a world-class education is at the core of academic success. U.S. News and World Report ranked Colorado State in its top tier in its annual "America's Best Colleges" report. The university offers 72 majors and 27 minors, and many of its programs are ranked among the best in the country.

Colorado State continues to push forward in its mission to provide the best possible education. Construction recently was completed on the state-of-the-art University Center for the Arts and Computer Science buildings and the Rockwell Hall expansion at the College of Business.

**S**ince its founding as a military fort in 1864, Fort Collins has anchored northern Colorado's rich heritage of academic, business and recreational pursuits. Hiking, mountain biking, kayaking, river rafting and rock climbing are just a few popular outdoor pursuits for students and residents.



The city maintains more than 600 acres of parks, 30,000 acres of natural areas, 29 miles of off-street trails for hiking and biking, and four golf courses. Old Town, the heart of Fort Collins, offers a one-of-a-kind shopping experience and more than 80 restaurants, in addition to a vibrant night life and multiple cultural arts centers.



**Horsetooth Reservoir, located just a few miles west of CSU's main campus, offers great outdoors opportunities including camping, boating, fishing, swimming, hiking, climbing and more.**



**T**he Denver Metro Area, with a population of 2.4 million, is less than an hour's drive from Fort Collins. Three of its teams have competed for their respective world championships in the past 15 years, and Colorado fans are among the most passionate in the nation. Denver has all the features of any big city, including great shopping and nightlife on the 16th Street Mall (Denver Pavilions, right), a one-of-a-kind concert venue in Red Rocks Amphitheatre (below, right), an adrenaline-inducing amusement park in Elitch Gardens (below, left), and the world's 10th-busiest airport, Denver International.



**S**tudent-athletes at Colorado State are students first, and a quality learning environment is essential to achieving the high standards expected of them. That's why, in 2009, the Anderson Academic & Training Center was completed, offering Rams student-athletes a first-class academic facility.



#### Features:

- Includes a computer lab with 30 workstations, more workspace and offices for CSU's academic staff.
- Features five private tutorial rooms and large study areas.

The training portion includes a state-of-the-art weight room and strength and conditioning center, in addition to a nutrition center.



#### **ATHLETIC TRAINING ROOM**

Additionally, during the summer of 2013, the athletic training room went through a major transformation, nearly doubling in size, helping make it one of the finest in the country. It features a multitude of taping and treatment tables, rehabilitation equipment and more.





**A**lso established in 2009 was the Indoor Practice Facility, measuring more than 66,000 square feet. The structure allows the team to practice and train indoors during bad weather.

**Features:**

- Contains a 70-yard synthetic-turf football field, including one end zone.
- Can accommodate all 16 varsity sports, and includes a four-lane, 70 meter track, large gymnasium and more.



# RYUN WILLIAMS

Head Coach | Third Season | South Dakota; '92, '97

Ryun Williams, a 20-year coaching veteran, completed his second season as the head coach of the Colorado State women's basketball program and was named Mountain West Coach of the Year following an outstanding program turnaround.

Williams led the Rams from 11-19 (.367) in his first season to 25-8 (.758) in 2013-14. That improvement ranked as the third-best turnaround in the country, and is the best in program history. The WBCA awarded Williams with the 2014 Russell Athletic/WBCA NCAA DI Regional Coach of the Year award.

Tasked with repairing what has been nearly a decade of sub-par results, Williams brought eight new faces to the Rams' 2013-14 roster in his second season at the helm. The team quickly realized it had an irrefutable chemistry, which resulted in eight- and 10-game win streaks, totaling 17 wins in 18 games, skyrocketing them to the top of the Mountain West standings and their first regular-season championship in 12 years.

The Rams, who were picked to finish seventh in 2013-14 Mountain West preseason poll, more than doubled their win total from the previous season, producing the best record in 13 years, and the third-most victories in program history.

The team earned a program-record 10 all-conference awards to six players, in addition to a MW Coach of the Year nod for the second-year coach. The Rams also received their first postseason invitation in 10 years, with a trip to the WNIT.

With over 20 seasons in coaching, including 19 as a head coach, Williams has compiled an impressive 348-218 career record, with stops at South Dakota (2008-12), Wayne State College (1998-2008) and Sheridan College (1995-98), leading his squads to seven campaigns of 20 or more victories, five postseason berths and two conference championships.

Before coming to Colorado State, Williams was South Dakota's head coach for four seasons. He led the Coyotes to a highly successful stretch during their transition to Division I competition, and helped them become one of the nation's premier defensive teams.

A staple of the Coyotes under Williams has been defense, and that was no exception in 2011-12. They ranked second nationally in blocks per game (7.3), eighth in field-goal defense (33.2) and 12th in scoring defense (52.3), leading

the Summit League in all three categories. The Coyotes qualified for the WNIT for the first time ever last season as a Division-I program, which was their second straight postseason berth after competing in the Women's Basketball Invitational in 2010-11. South Dakota finished with a No. 97 rank in the RPI, the second-highest of any Summit League team and the highest mark in school history.

Prior to arriving at USD in 2008, Williams spent 10 seasons at Wayne State, building that program into a perennial contender in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference.

Williams took over a program that had won just 13 games the previous two seasons and turned it into an NCAA tournament team. His team's recorded 20 wins or more in three of his final four seasons and made appearances in the NCAA Division II North Central Region tournament in two of the last three seasons. While at Wayne State, he compiled a 181-105 record (.632) and became the winningest women's basketball coach in school history.

In 2007-08, he guided the Wildcats to a 21-9 record, which included a trip to the NCAA Tournament. In the first round of the North Central Region he led his team to an 85-78 upset of North Dakota for the first win in the NCAA tournament in the school's history. In 2005-06, Williams took Wayne State to its first-ever trip to the NCAA tournament, as the team notched its best season in school history by going 27-4. They were 13-1 in NSIC play and won the NSIC tournament to earn automatic berth to the NCAA tournament. That season Williams was named the NSIC Coach of the Year.

Williams' players have received plenty of postseason recognition. He has had players named WBCA All-America honorable mention, NSIC Player of the Year and NSIC Tournament MVP. Two players earned NSIC Defensive Player of

the Year honors, two won the Dodie Martin and two were named the league's newcomers of the year.

Before taking over at Wayne State, Williams was the women's head coach at Sheridan College (Wyo.) for three seasons. While there he was named the Wyoming Conference Coach of the Year twice and was the Region IX Coach of the Year.

In 1993 he began his head coaching career at Sheridan when he served as the volleyball head coach and men's basketball assistant coach. In his time as the head coach of the volleyball program he put together a 117-66 record. In 1995 Sheridan went 42-8, won the Region IX title and finished fifth at the junior college national tournament. Williams garnered Wyoming Conference and Region IX Coach of the Year honors in 1994 and 1995.

Sheridan is also where Williams began his collegiate playing career. He played two seasons at Sheridan, where he was an All-Region IX player as a sophomore. In addition he was a two-time All-Wyoming Conference performer and a two-time academic all-conference selection. He then transferred to South Dakota where he earned All-NCC honors after leading the nation in free throw percentage at 91.2 percent. Williams was also named academic all-conference as a junior and senior. As a high school senior at Campbell County High School, he was named Mr. Basketball for the state of Wyoming in 1988.

A native of Gillette, Wyo., Williams earned his associate's degree from Sheridan in 1990, his bachelor's degree from South Dakota in 1992 and his master's degree from South Dakota in 1997.

Williams and his wife, Lyndy, have two daughters, Natalie and Emily.

# TIM MOSER

Assistant Coach | Third Season | CSU-Pueblo, '98

Tim Moser begins his third season with the Rams after a very successful stretch at Alaska Anchorage. As head coach at UAA, Tim

Moser elevated the Seawolf program among the elite in NCAA Division II women's basketball.

With a 150-31 record, Moser compiled the highest percentage (.829) among active D-II women's coaches and the seventh-best among all divisions, following the end of the 2011-12 campaign. His Seawolf squads advanced to at least the second round of the NCAA Tournament in each of his seasons, including consecutive Final Four appearances in 2008 and 2009, and another NCAA Elite Eight berth in 2012. Under his guidance, the Seawolves earned three NCAA West Region titles, two Great Northwest Athletic Conference regular-season crowns, two GNAC Tournament titles and two 30-win seasons.

In Moser's tenure, only two other D-II women's programs posted as many victories as the Seawolves and none were ranked in the WBCA/ESPN Top 25 Coaches' Poll for as many consecutive weeks (81). The Seawolves dropped no lower than No. 19 over a 5-year span (2007-12) - the only club in D-II to make that claim.

The 2011-12 Seawolves won the GNAC title, finishing No. 7 in the final national rankings. With Moser capturing his third GNAC Coach of the Year award, UAA became the first basketball program - women's or men's - to sweep the league's major honors, with Player of the Year, Newcomer of the Year and Freshman of the Year accolades.

In 2008-09, Moser's squad won 31 games - a record for all UAA sports for the second straight year. Moser also received the 2009 WBCA Div. II West Region Coach of the Year honor as UAA captured a share of its first conference title in 20 years.

As a D-II rookie coach in 2006-07, Moser was voted GNAC Coach of the Year after leading the Seawolves to 23-6 record and the team's first NCAA Tournament victory in seven seasons. UAA recorded the eighth-biggest turnaround in D-II from 2005-06 to '06-07 as he took over a program that had averaged just 10.7 wins the previous six years.

A former Seawolf player, Moser returned to UAA in April 2006 from Otero (Colo.) Junior College, where he coached against Head Coach Ryun Williams who led Sheridan College at the time. He won 74 percent of his games and captured nine conference coach-of-the-year awards, coaching both the women's and men's teams. He coached the OJC men exclusively the final two seasons, after leading the men and women simultaneously the previous six years.

In six seasons with the Lady Rattlers, Moser compiled a 137-41 record and won five straight conference championships from 1998-02. With the men, he registered a 172-68 mark, winning four league titles.

Moser's student-athletes at OJC compiled an even more incredible record of success in the classroom, with the men ranking among the nation's top five teams in terms of grade-point average for five straight years, and the women holding a top-10 academic rank for six years in a row. During Moser's 14 combined seasons as head coach, the Rattlers produced 15 Academic All-Americans, 52 Academic All-Region performers, and all but one player graduated from the two-year school.

In 20 seasons as a head coach, Moser accumulated a 459-129 record, with 14 combined seasons spent on the junior college level (eight men/six women) and six on the D-II level. His tally on the women's side is 287-61.

Moser received his bachelor's degree in social sciences from Colorado State-Pueblo in 1998.



## **BROOKE ATKINSON**

Assistant Coach | First Season | Wichita State '03

Atkinson begins her first season with the Rams from South Dakota, where she worked under Williams for one season before he was hired at CSU. In her three seasons with the Coyotes, she helped guide them to three postseason berths, including the team's first ever NCAA DI tournament appearance following a Summit League tournament championship in 2014.

Prior to her time spent up north, Atkinson was an assistant coach from 2003-10 at New Mexico State. While there she helped lead the Aggies to three WAC championship games, and the team's first postseason appearance in 16 years in 2010. She was recognized for her efforts when she was promoted to second assistant in 2005, and she later won the school's Outstanding Coach Award in 2008.

A Colorado native, Atkinson attended Westminster High School before beginning her collegiate playing career at Western Nebraska Community College. She then moved on to Wichita State, where she played for two seasons with the Shockers. Atkinson graduated from Wichita State in 2003 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education. She later earned her master's degree from New Mexico State in educational curriculum in 2008.



## **REBECCA ALVIDREZ**

Assistant Coach | First Season | Adams State '06

Alvidrez joins the Colorado State coaching staff from Nebraska Omaha, where she spent two years as an assistant with the Mavericks. While there she played an integral role in recruiting, with strong ties to Europe and the West Coast. Alvidrez had played one season of professional basketball in Sweden with Brahe Basket in 2003-04.

Following a successful playing career as the point guard at Otero Junior College and Montana State, Alvidrez began her coaching career in 2002 at Otero under then head coach Moser. She spent four years with the Rattlers' men's and women's teams before moving on to the University of Alaska Anchorage in 2006, where she helped lead the women's squad to unprecedented heights at the NCAA Division II level.

An Albuquerque, N.M., native, Alvidrez was a two-time all-Big Sky selection and was named Newcomer of the Year at Montana State. Before then at Otero, she led her team to two conference titles and was awarded two junior-college All-American honors.



## KIM AUSTIN MBADINGA

Director of Operations | Third Season | Colorado State; '98

Kim Austin Mbadinga-Nzamba begins her third season with Colorado State women's basketball as the director of operations for the Rams. She previously served as the recruiting coordinator in her first season at Colorado State.

Austin Mbadinga-Nzamba returned to her alma mater after six seasons as an assistant coach at Rice.

While at Rice, Austin Mbadinga-Nzamba served as the staff's recruiting coordinator and worked with the Owl's perimeter players. She also oversaw the student-athletes academic progress in conjunction with the athletic academic advising team and compliance with the NCAA Clearinghouse and NCAA by-laws.

She joined the Rice staff after serving as an assistant at Southern Polytechnic State in Marietta, Ga. At the NAIA school, Austin Mbadinga-Nzamba coached the post players in addition to serving as recruiting coordinator, scheduling coordinator and supervisor for weight training and conditioning.

Prior to working with Southern Poly, Austin Mbadinga-Nzamba spent one year as an assistant with Life University, also in Marietta, Ga., after a two-year stint at Saint Louis University. She organized team travel, coordinated the film exchange and aided in recruiting in addition to her on-court coaching duties with both programs.

Austin Mbadinga-Nzamba is a 1998 graduate of Colorado State with a B.A. in social sciences and a minor in sociology. She was a four-year letterwinner for the Rams, helping them to the Western Athletic Conference regular season and tournament titles, then the program's first NCAA tournament bid in 1996 under head coach Greg Williams.

As a senior captain, Austin Mbadinga-Nzamba helped lead Colorado State to the WAC Mountain Division title and a trip to the NCAA tournament second round in 1998 with teammates Becky Hammon and Katie Cronin. During her career the Rams won 20 or more games in three seasons, advancing the NCAA tournament twice.

After graduating from CSU, Austin Mbadinga-Nzamba spent one season playing professionally for Salon Palloilidat Salpa in Finland where she averaged 18 points and nine rebounds. In high school, she was a 1993-94 Street & Smith's All-America Honorable Mention and a Basketball Congress International All-American.

Kim, a native of El Paso, Texas, and her husband, Eric Mbadinga-Nzamba, have three children.



## ASHLEY WIENS

Video Coordinator | First Season | Colorado State; '13

Ashley Wiens joins the Rams women's basketball staff for her first season this fall.

A former walk-on at Colorado State in 2011-12, Wiens remained on the Rams' staff as a student manager following the appointment of Head Coach Williams in 2012. A critical component of the squad for games both home and away, Wiens assisted the staff in nearly all areas, including gameday and practice operations. She will now serve as the Rams' video coordinator and will play a vital role as assistant director of operations, while helping with camps and social media.

A native of Grand Junction, Colo., Wiens played in nine games for CSU during her junior season, averaging 1.1 points per contest. She graduated this past December with a bachelor's degree in food and nutritional sciences.



## CHAD LAVIN

Assistant Coach | Third Season | South Dakota; '78, '83

Chad Lavin returned to women's basketball in 2012-13 after a four-year hiatus from coaching.

In his third season with the Rams, Lavin brings with him 26 years of head coaching experience, including 12 years at the Division I level. He will serve as a team consultant for the 2014-15 season, and will not recruit, but remains in charge of gameday prep, opponent scouting and practice evaluation.

A Division II Russell Athletic/WBCA National Coach of the Year and two-time Regional Coach of the Year, Lavin (56) opted for early retirement in 2008, after guiding his South Dakota squad to the NCAA championship game. The Coyotes finished the season 33-2, the best record in school history, and they received a No. 2 final ranking in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll.

Lavin ended his career at USD the all-time winningest coach (273-141; .659), and he was inducted in the South Dakota Sports Hall of Fame in 2011.

In between his first four year stint (1982-86) and his last 10 years (1998-2008) at South Dakota, Lavin was head coach of the Rams' Border War rival Wyoming for 12 seasons (1986-1998). While there he amassed a 175-162 (.519) record and led the Cowgirls to four top three conference finishes, including their only regular-season league title in 1989-90. That year the team went 24-8 overall and posted its best conference winning percentage in the history of the program at .900 (9-1).

All told Lavin has mentored seven national playoff teams and he has seven seasons with 20 or more wins on his résumé. He has been named North Central Conference Coach of the Year four times (1982-83, 1984-85, 2002-03, 2007-08), South Dakota Collegiate Coach of the Year (1984-85), High Country Athletic Conference Coach of the Year twice (1986-87, 1989-90) and was the North Central Region Coach of the Year in 2002-03.

He has coached five NCC MVPs and five CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, including former director of women's basketball operations, Mandy Koupal.

## REMAINING AT THE TOP

Predicted to finish first in the Mountain West preseason poll, the 2014-15 Colorado State women's basketball team will look to defend its 2014 regular-season championship with a schedule that features 16 regular-season home games highlighted by a key matchups against 2014 Mountain West tournament champion Fresno State, and runner-up in the conference preseason poll, Boise State.

### NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE

CSU opens the regular-season at Moby Arena vs. **Hawai'i** on Nov. 14. The Rams were the only team to defeat UH last year on its home court in the Waikiki Beach Marriott Rainbow Wahine Showdown. Following the opener, Colorado State will complete its three-game homestand with Colorado Mines (Nov. 18) and Illinois State (Nov. 23).

The team won't travel far for its lone tournament of the non-conference slate. The Rams will take part in the Omni Hotels Classic at the Coors Events Center in Boulder after the Thanksgiving holiday. CSU's first-round challenger is a former Mountain West foe in **TCU** on Nov. 28. It will be the Rams' first encounter with the Horned Frogs since they left the conference for the Big 12 in 2012.

The squad will then play either **Missouri State** or host school **Colorado** on Nov. 29. CU defeated TCU in the first round of the WNIT last season. The Buffaloes then advanced to the round of 16 before falling to tournament runner-up UTEP. Last year the Rams nearly pulled an upset over the then No. 17 Buffaloes, losing by just four points, 63-59, early in the year.

The Rams will have only two flights before Mountain West action begins, and they will both be in the same week. The team travels to **Drake** on Dec. 3, followed by another former conference opponent, **BYU**, on Dec. 6. Due to both schools potentially hosting first round matches in the NCAA volleyball tournament that weekend, the Rams and Cougars will play in Salt Lake City, Utah, at Energy Solutions Arena, home to the NBA's Utah Jazz.

BYU is one of two schools the Rams will face that earned a spot in the NCAA tournament last season. The Cougars made it to the Sweet 16 before losing to eventual champion Connecticut, 70-51. The Rams will be looking to end a long winless streak against BYU. The last time CSU earned a win over the Cougars was in 2004.

Following its four-game road stretch, CSU will be home for the remainder of the non-conference schedule. The Rams challenge DII opponent **South Dakota Mines** for the third consecutive year on Dec. 9, in-state rival **Denver** on Dec. 11, **Florida Atlantic** on Dec. 14 and fellow WNIT participant **Cal Poly** on Dec. 21. The Mustangs were eliminated in the first round, falling at San Diego, 82-59.

### MOUNTAIN WEST SLATE

In the 22 team, 18-game format schedule, Colorado State will have home-and home contests vs. nine of the 11 full-time MW members. The Rams will not play at Utah State or UNLV at home this season.

Colorado State will open Mountain West play following the holiday season on Dec. 31 at **Boise State**. From there the Rams will play home and away as they travel through the MW slate until February.

The Rams host **New Mexico** for its league home-opener on Jan. 3. CSU will then complete its first round vs. the Front Range schools, traveling to Laramie for the first installment of the Border War at **Wyoming** on Jan. 7, followed by **Air Force** at home on Jan. 10.

The squad will make its first trip to the Pacific Time Zone on Jan. 14 when CSU takes on **Nevada**. The Rams will then take on **San José State** (Jan. 17) at home, enjoy a mid-week bye on Jan. 21, followed by a trip to the West Coast to challenge **San Diego State** on Jan. 24.

CSU will see **Boise State** for the second time on Jan. 28 before a championship-game rematch at **Fresno State** on Jan. 31. The 22-11 Bulldogs lost in the first round of the NCAA tournament to Nebraska in March.

The Rams then welcome **Wyoming** to Moby Arena to begin the second month of the conference schedule on Feb. 4. The Border War matchup will be the Rams' annual Orange Out, celebrating CSU's Aggie heritage.

Beginning Feb. 7 at **UNLV**, the Rams will close out the remainder of the regular season with a two-home, two-away game format. CSU travels to **New Mexico** on Feb. 11, and is then back home for two games vs. **San Diego State** in CSU's Play4Kay Pink Out contest on Feb. 14, and **Fresno State** on Feb. 18.

From there the Rams will travel to **Air Force** (Feb. 21) and **San José State** (Feb. 25). Colorado State will close the regular season at home vs. **Nevada** on March 3 and **Utah State** on March 6.

### 2015 MOUNTAIN WEST BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIPS

During the summer the conference announced a format change to the 2015 Mountain West Basketball Championships, which will be played March 9-14 at the Thomas & Mack Center in Las Vegas.

The women's portion will include a shorter break in between rounds and close with the championship game on Friday. First round games will begin Monday with the No. 6 through 11 seeds, followed by the quarterfinal round on Tuesday and the semifinals on Wednesday.

## ***RETURNING TO EXCELLENCE***

Last season the Rams surprised everyone but themselves, finishing 15-3 in Mountain West play and capturing the regular-season crown following a seventh place preseason projection. It was CSU's first championship in 12 years. Colorado State's 25-8 record overall accounted for the third-biggest turnaround in the country following 2012-13's 11-19 tally.

At 25-8 the team secured its first 20-win campaign in 11 years under MW and Regional Coach of the Year Ryun Williams, in just his second season at the helm. The Rams compiled their best record in 15 years, while accumulating the fourth-longest home-court win streak in the 39-year history of CSU women's basketball at 13 contests.

The 2013-14 campaign marked the most wins ever for CSU in conference action and the most overall wins in 12 years. Despite falling in the championship game of the Mountain West tournament after a grueling triple-overtime win over Wyoming in the

semifinals, Colorado State earned its first trip to the postseason since 2004 with an automatic berth to the WNIT.

The recipient of four all-conference awards, freshman Ellen Nystrom posted the school's first triple-double (men's or women's) with 11 points, 14 rebounds and 10 assists in a Rams' 101-60 rout over San José State. The Rams also completed five regular-season sweeps over Mountain West foes, setting records along the way. CSU set a school record with 19 three-pointers vs. San Diego State and the team earned its first victory over New Mexico at The Pit in 16 years.

Colorado State's 60-point victory over Air Force ranked as the seventh largest scoring margin of all-time. A large part of the Rams success was due to taking care of the basketball. CSU finished the year ranked in the top 10 nationally in both turnovers (11.8) and assist-to-turnover ratio (1.37).



CSU 68 vs. Creighton 79

Colorado State earned a spot in the WNIT after amassing a 17-11 record through the regular season. The Rams hosted the Creighton Blue Jays in Moby Arena in first-round play of the WNIT. 

**MEDIA CREDENTIALS**

- Media credentials are distributed on a season or single-game basis. Requests should be made at least one week prior to an event.

- Credentials will be left prior to the game at media will call, located at the lower (ground level) southwest entrance of Moby Arena, adjacent to the Anderson Academic & Training Center and north of the Ram Field softball complex.

**PHOTOGRAPHER CREDENTIALS**

- Photo credentials are issued only to accredited photographers. Passes must be displayed at all times.
- Photographer's boxes are located at both ends of the playing court, on the south side of each basket standard, opposite the team benches. Still and video photographers are allowed to be positioned in either of these boxes only.
- Photography is not allowed from any of the courtside media or donor seating along either baseline or the south side of the playing court, the team bench area, or official scorer's table.
- No photography equipment (i.e., cameras, strobes) shall be attached to the backboard, goal standards or tables located courtside without specific, prior written permission.
- Still photographers may not utilize flash attachments at any courtside location.
- Tripods may not be placed on or beside the playing floor, or on any table.
- Upper-level still and video photographer positions are located above the south side seating areas and in the press box overhead on the north side. Photographers are unable to use the south side location for any game that is being televised. Individuals seeking to use the north side location must be granted permission by a member of the athletic media relations staff.

**PARKING**

- Access to the parking lot immediately west of the McGraw Center will require an "A" permit from 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. weekdays.
- Annual permits can be purchased through the Office of Parking Management Web site: [www.colostate.edu/depts/parking](http://www.colostate.edu/depts/parking).
- Event parking permits will be made available to credentialed media for home games at Moby Arena. To acquire an event parking pass contact a member of the CSU media relations staff.

**GAME NOTES**

- Game notes are available at least 48 hours prior to each game (except on days with back-to-back games) on the school's official Web site, CSURams.com. News releases also will be e-mailed to media outlets upon request.

**INTERVIEW GUIDELINES**

- Interviews, either in person or via telephone, with members of Colorado State's women's basketball coaching staff and student athletes must be coordinated through assistant media relations director Danielle Marshall.
- Home and/or cell phone numbers will not be provided to the media, by the coaches, student-athletes, or the athletic department. Media are asked not to request an individual's personal contact information, including e-mail and cell number, but rather to contact Danielle Marshall.
- Student-athletes and coaches are available for interviews at the conclusion of selected practice sessions. Student-athlete interviews will not conflict with classes, meetings, medical treatment or practice times.
- Interviews are not permitted in the locker room or training room.
- No pregame interviews will be granted on game days.
- Telephone interviews should be requested at least 24 hours in advance and coordinated through Danielle Marshall. All interviews will be processed on an availability basis including the requested interviewee.

**POSTGAME GUIDELINES**

- At the conclusion of every game, Colorado State coach Ryan Williams will use the NCAA-suggested 10-minute cooling period to address members of the team.
- At the conclusion of the NCAA-suggested cooling period, Williams will address the media in the Adolf Coors Family Foundation Auditorium, Room 100, in the McGraw Athletic Center.
- Colorado State's locker room is closed to the media at all times. Specific players will be brought to the press conference upon request.
- The media relations office will do its best to accommodate all properly made requests.
- Other than network contractual obligations, no student-athlete or coach can appear on a live postgame television or radio interview without permission obtained prior to the game from Danielle Marshall.

**BROADCAST RIGHTS AND RESTRICTIONS**

Colorado State, its opponent and the respective conference designate the broadcast rights for all games. CSU follows the guidelines established by the NCAA Championship Events Committee. Radio and television stations and Internet sites that have not purchased rights shall not carry any broadcast report from the arena on a live basis or any live description, footage of any game action while it is still in progress. No pregame and, or postgame live coverage shall be permitted for two hours before and one-half hour after the sporting event without the express permission of the university. Per NCAA guidelines, stations are limited to three minutes of highlights per news show. Television stations also are prohibited from selling, loaning or giving away footage to any individual or agency for use on any non-sports-news program produced or aired by the station. Games that are broadcast by television networks may have additional restrictions. Also, per NCAA regulations, footage and photos of athletes with eligibility remaining may NOT be used to commercially promote any product, service or media outlet and may not be sold, loaned to other individuals, agencies for this purpose. Disrespect of credential privileges will result in withdrawal of all future credentials.

**THIS IS THE MOUNTAIN WEST**

From its inception in 1999, the Mountain West has been committed to excellence in intercollegiate athletics, while promoting the academic missions of its member institutions. Progressive in its approach, the MW continues to cultivate opportunities for student-athletes to compete at the highest level, while fostering academic achievement and sportsmanship. Now in its 16th year, the MW has been assertive in its involvement with the NCAA governance structure and has taken a leadership role in the overall administration of intercollegiate athletics.

The Mountain West has marked several achievements over its first 15 years of existence, most notably becoming the first to establish a sports television network dedicated solely to an intercollegiate athletic conference (The Mtn.). The Mountain West also was the first to experiment with the coaches' challenge in the college football instant replay system, and was the first non-automatic-qualifying BCS conference to participate in four BCS bowl games, winning three. Additionally, the Mountain West was the first conference to have a member institution with No. 1 overall picks in both the NFL and NBA drafts in the same year (Utah's Alex Smith and Andrew Bogut, respectively in 2005). With San Diego State's Stephen Strasburg claiming the No. 1 pick in the 2009 MLB Draft, the Mountain West is one of two conferences to have the No. 1 selection in each of the NFL, NBA and MLB drafts since the MW was founded in 1999. In 2011-12, the Mountain West was among the first conferences to implement a league-wide state-of-the-art basketball instant replay system.

The Mountain West is noted for its geographic diversity. Some of the most beautiful terrain and landscapes in the nation can be found within Mountain West boundaries, including the majestic Rocky Mountain range, which borders five MW institutions (Air Force, Boise State, Colorado State, New Mexico and Utah State). The high plains of Wyoming (elevation 7,220 feet – the highest Division I campus in the nation) contrast with the desert cities of Las Vegas and Reno, home to UNLV and Nevada, respectively, while Fresno State, San Diego State and San Jose State add a West coast influence with their locations in Central, Southern and Northern California. The inclusion of the Hawai'i football program extends the Mountain West footprint to the beautiful islands in the Pacific Ocean.

**HISTORY**

The Mountain West was conceived on May 26, 1998, when the presidents of eight institutions — Air Force, BYU, Colorado State, New Mexico, San Diego State, UNLV, Utah and Wyoming — decided to form a new NCAA Division I-A intercollegiate athletic conference. The split from a former 16-team conference re-established continuity and stability among the membership within the new league and signaled the continuation of its tradition-rich, long-standing athletic rivalries. Three of the MW's eight original members have been conference rivals since the 1960s (New Mexico, Wyoming and Colorado State), while San Diego State (1978) and Air Force (1980) were longtime members as well. UNLV and TCU entered the fold in 1996 and the Rebels continued as one of the original eight institutions that formed the MW in 1999. TCU re-joined the group with its first year of competition in the Mountain West in 2005-06. With conference realignment sweeping the nation in recent years, the MW has been proactive in addressing membership changes. Boise State University joined the Mountain West in 2011-12, followed by Fresno State and the University of Nevada on July 1, 2012. Also on July 1, 2012, the University of Hawai'i became a football-only member of the Conference. On July 1, 2013, the Mountain West further expanded when San Jose State University and Utah State University joined the Conference, bringing to 11 the number of full-time member institutions and 12 football-playing members.

When the Mountain West officially began operations on July 1, 1999, the new league had in place a seven-year contract with ESPN, giving the broadcaster exclusive national television rights to MW football and men's basketball, and three-year agreements to send the league's football champion to the Liberty Bowl and a second team to the Las Vegas Bowl. Commissioner Craig Thompson also arranged a third bowl tie-in each of the first three seasons (1999 Motor City, 2000 Silicon Valley, 2001 New Orleans) before securing a four-year deal with the Emerald Bowl in San Francisco in 2002. Entering the 2014 season, the MW has eight (8) different bowl games that in any given year will generate six (6) or seven (7) postseason opportunities for its member institutions. These include primary positions in some or all years with the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl, Famous Idaho Potato Bowl, Glidan New Mexico Bowl, R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl, Royal Purple Las Vegas Bowl, San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl and Hawai'i Bowl - and a secondary position with the Valley of the Sun Bowl.

An innovator in the postseason bowl structure, the MW engineered many "firsts," as league teams have participated in five inaugural bowl games (2000 Silicon Valley, 2001 New Orleans, 2002 San Francisco (Emerald), 2005 Poinsettia, 2006 New Mexico), as well as placing the first non-automatic-qualifying BCS team into a BCS bowl game with Utah's appearance in the 2005 Tostitos Fiesta Bowl.
