FOREWORD

The following abridged bibliography contains references relative to the economic impacts of the salinity component of water pollution. It was extracted from my microfiche library of over 400 documents. While not exhaustive, it includes many important references dealing with the physical and biological, as well as economic, aspects of salinity pollution.

This bibliography is being developed as part of an economic water quality study conducted by Dr. Robert A. Young, Department of Economics, Colorado State University, under the sponsorship of the Office of Water Resources Research, U. S. Department of Interior. It will be particularly useful for anyone interested in investigating the economics of water quality in the Colorado River Basin, with emphasis on salinity problems in the Grand Valley Area of the Upper Colorado River Basin.

The bibliography contains four sections - author, title, source, and master lists - which were generated by a computer library routine. The computer program used to generate the bibliography in its various forms was developed by Dr. Lee D. Miller of the Department of Watershed Sciences, Colorado State University, in conjunction with a National Science Foundation Grant in Special Projects in Graduate Education.* The original computer printout was reduced and reproduced just as originally printed. The author list presents the citations in alphabetical order according to author. Similarly, the title and source lists present

the citations in alphabetical order according to title and source, respectively. The master list presents a numerical listing of all entries, including any comment cards. The letters J, K, or S appearing after the document numbers indicate the type of citation.

J = document occurs as a 4" x 6" microfiche in my library

K = only a reference citation (no document in my library)

S = journal or book which usually can be found in a university library

The American Institute of Biological Science Style Manual was the guide used in forming the citations.

The three columns of numbers between the DATE and DOC NO in the master list indicate the number of microfiche sleeves, the card type number, and the card type, respectively. For example, the 1 1 1 in document 2J may be interpreted as follows. The first 1 indicates the document constitutes one microfiche sleeve of up to 60 pages. The second 1 is a counter. It indicates the number of the particular card type (i.e., first, second, third, etc., of the author, title, source, or comment cards). The third 1 tells the card type, in this case author card. Similarly, a 2 in the third column identifies a title card; a 5 identifies a source card; and a 7 identifies a comment card.

The development of this library is an ongoing process. Relevant citations will be added as they are encountered. Contributions and suggestions by readers, either about references on the economics of water quality and related subjects, or about the bibliography itself, are welcomed. In the near future the documents will be subject-coded and their subject categories added to their computer entries and output lists

prepared by various subject categories.
